

Science, Nature, and the Environment

Environmental science and geography

Benefit from one of the world's best 'living laboratories' set in the spectacular natural habitat of the Scottish Highlands. Studying Geography or Environmental Science at UHI Inverness offers access to outstanding nature sites such as the newly inscribed Flow Country peatland UNESCO World Heritage Site and Cairngorms National Park.

UNESCO site: Flow Country

→ BSc (Hons) Environmental Science

Study in spectacular natural habitats and develop your field skills in the Scottish Highlands and beyond. Develop core skills through course work in campus labs, and access specialist analytical equipment across the university network.

→ BSc (Hons) Geography

Explore a mix of physical, environmental and human geography. Learn about biodiversity, atmosphere, climate, ecosystems, tourism, design skills, globalisation, society, and more, along with a third-year work placement module with an external agency.

Both of these degree programmes at UHI Inverness offer:

- Practical field and lab work comprising a large part of the course, giving students highly valuable experience to take into their careers
- + State of the art laboratory facilities across the university network
- + Field trips in the local area, plus residential field trips within Scotland
- + Opportunity to undertake an international fieldtrip in Iceland
- Specialist subject pathway options: Environmental Biology or Environmental Biotechnology
- + UK dual citizens also have the additional option of Environmental Science with Archaeology


Forestry



Marine science

Founded in 1884 by Sir John Murray, the father of oceanography, the Scottish Association for Marine Science (SAMS) is Scotland's premier independent marine research institution. The beach front campus offers an enormous wealth of marine and coastal environments right outside your door.

→ BSc (Hons) Marine Science students enjoy first-hand interactions with marine science experts, collecting samples and data on research vessels, in aquaria and on the seashore, and developing great laboratory skills. You can also graduate via:

- + Marine Science with Arctic Studies
- + Marine Science with Marine Biology
- + Marine Science with Oceanography and Robotics



SAMS gives you access to excellent marine laboratory facilities, with diverse and highly relevant modules delivered by active world-class researchers.

There are also opportunities to spend one or two semesters at the University Centre in Svalbard (UNIS) in the Arctic Circle, Coastal Carolina in the USA, or another of our partner universities.

About studying in Oban

- Three miles east of the popular tourist town of Oban, within easy reach you will find Dunstaffnage peninsula, home to the Scottish Association for Marine Science (SAMS) campus
- + Dedicated student accommodation on campus
- + Oban is a small coastal university town with around 8500 people surrounded by a stunning environment and abundant wildlife
- Due to its thriving tourist industry in the summer, its growing student population, and as a rural hub, the town provides more facilities and services than its size suggests




BSc (Hons) Marine Science



History, Heritage, and Social Studies

Archaeology

The Highlands and Islands of Scotland is home to world-renowned sites such as Skara Brae, Maeshowe, the Camster Cairns, and Mousa Broch, some of which predate Stonehenge and are up to 5,000 years old. Explore Scotland's Viking connections, investigate the history of Britain, Europe, and the Atlantic World, and learn to question the information you're presented with, as well as the voices they do and don't represent.



BSc (Hons) Archaeological Science lets you focus on the science of archaeology combined with developing excavation skills, techniques in field-based evidence, and ethics. Cover subjects like sustainability, biomolecular archaeology, digital heritage, and wetland archaeology.

Both degree programmes at UHI Archaeology Institute offer:

- + Work placement opportunities to gain real-world experience
- + Laboratory-based study, field schools, and active engagement in research
- Participation in worldrenowned archaeological excavations, both in Orkney and internationally

Engineering and **Technology**

Aircraft

Take advantage of world-class facilities, including hangar spaces for practical activities that simulate an active commercial European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and UK Civil Aviation Authority (UKCAA) Part 145 maintenance environment.

→ BSc (Hons) Aircraft Maintenance Engineering and Management at UHI Perth is the only one of its kind in Scotland, where you can graduate with a degree leading to an annual salary of about £60,000 (source: uk.talent. com), plus the opportunity to obtain an approved EASA



BSc (Hons) Aircraft Maintenance Engineering and Management

and/or UKCAA Part-66 Certificate of Recognition too. Unlike many other aircraft management courses, the third year provides an insight into the management roles within an aircraft maintenance environment and the wider knowledge and skills required by the aviation industry.

Our aircraft courses are accredited by the Royal Aeronautical Society, and meet the syllabus requirements of EASA and UKCAA. We also offer **HNC and HND Aircraft Engineering** as pathways into this degree.

Gain practical experience in recording and producing bands, broadcast content, and working in professional theatres and live venues. Collaborate with music students on live projects, and learn technical skills in game audio, immersive audio in VR and in Dolby Atmos and 5.1, music production, live and broadcast events, and sound for TV and films.



Hospitality and Events



→ BA (Hons) Hospitality Management has incredible opportunities to study and work with the best in Scottish hospitality, such as The Gleneagles Hotel. Work closely with local and international students to gain a globally recognised qualification with paid internships at our industry partners.

Past students from our UHI Perth training kitchen, including Andrew Fairlie at Gleneagles and Tom Kitchin in Leith, have gone on to gain Michelin stars for their restaurants.







- + Fort William is the biggest settlement between Glasgow and Inverness, known as the 'Outdoor Capital of the UK'
- + Safe rural town home to the UK's highest mountain, Ben Nevis, and world-class local trad climbing routes
- + Many student clubs covering all kinds of interests
- + Well-equipped local gyms, and hospitality spots like restaurants, cafés, a bowling alley and bars locally
- + Surrounded by dramatic mountains with wild swimming, hiking, mountain biking, water sports, paddle sports, sailing, climbing and skateboarding to be enjoyed around the area
- + Train station for journeys to Glasgow with many stops in between, such as the iconic Corrour station

BA (Hons) Golf Management is the first honours degree of its kind in the UK – blending golf business management with golf skills for diverse options throughout a career in the industry. Skills in enterprise and marketing plus sustainable niche tourism, golf club management, events, and golf course maintenance and design.

membership, subject to application.

Gaelic Language and Culture

Language and culture

Study at the National Centre for Gaelic Language and Culture, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, on the Isle of Skye or in the vibrant Gaelic-speaking environment of Stornoway, exploring Gaelic society and its origins and digging deeper into its history. Learn to inspire others with your curiosity as you examine the roots and rich history of Gaelic while gaining a high level of fluency in the language.

BA (Hons) Gaelic develops your knowledge and critical awareness of Gaelic language, literature, and culture, whilst ensuring you achieve a high standard of fluency in the language. You will study the arts, contemporary and traditional literature, minority language issues and oral tradition, and explore the relationship of Gaelic to other languages, including Irish Gaelic. In your fourth year, you have the option to study for one semester at a university abroad.



→ BA (Hons) Gaelic and Traditional Music is the only Gaelic-medium degree programme that allows traditional musicians to study the music, history, and traditions of the Gàidhealtachd within the broader contexts of Gaelic and related

Minimum entry requirements for international students

Undergraduate degrees

- A-level: two A-levels at grade C or above, including any key subjects required for the course.
- United States: for courses that require Scottish Higher grades B, B, and C, we suggest a High School Graduation Diploma with a minimum grade point average of 2.7 or above.
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma: Award of Diploma with a minimum of 24 points, including any key subjects at Higher Level (HL) Grade 4 or 5, depending on the course.

+ Cost of living

The cost of living in the Highlands and Islands is relatively low compared to many other places in the UK. However, it is still vital that any potential student prepares their finances before they attend university. The average student studying at UHI will spend roughly between £10,000 and £18,000 per year.

UKVI sets living costs at £1,136 for each month of your course (up to a maximum of 9 months) as financial evidence needed for student visa purposes. Individual living costs will depend on your lifestyle choices. Some UHI campuses offer free breakfast or soup at lunchtime to support students with living costs.

+ Working whilst studying

As an international student you are permitted to work, however you must ensure that the work you do does not violate the terms of your visa. Student visa holders are permitted to work a maximum of 20 hours a week during term time and full-time outside term-time and on work placements.

If you are planning on studying on a different visa (e.g. Short term Study Visa, Dependant, Skilled Worker) you may be able to work. It is important that you check the guidance for your individual pathway.



Many students choose to work in hospitality and retail as the hours flexible to fit around their studies and social life. You may also gain work related to your studies, for example; lots of Adventure Studies students get experience at the local mountain resort Nevis Range. Your Student Association, HISA, also advertises jobs and offers employment through internships that could be a boost to your resume, and help you get involved with student activities at UHI.

+ U.S. Federal Aid

UHI is a participating institution in the Federal Direct Loan Program for U.S. citizens. This means eligible students can apply for financial support from the US government for their tuition fees, and in some cases support with their living costs.

+ EU/EEA and Swiss Nationals

Students who have spent the previous three years living in the EU/EEA or Switzerland will most likely be classified as INTEU or INTEUO and receive an automatic scholarship as a discount off the tuition fees listed opposite.

Subject to reapproval for 2026/27

Students studying full-time on campus, who have spent the previous three years living in the EU/EEA or Switzerland, will get an automatic scholarship for each degree year.

- Undergradate: For honours degree students, the 4th year of study will be free for those studying full-time, on continuous study, who have paid for the previous three years at the University of the Highlands and Islands.
- Scholarship amount, years 1-3:
- £3,000 per year for BA, BA (Hons) full time.
- £4,000 for year for BSc, BEng, BSc (Hons), BEng (Hons) full time HN programmes not eligible.
- Postgraduate: For postgraduate taught students studying on campus or online, those who have spent the previous three years living in the EU/EEA or Switzerland, will get an automatic scholarship of 25% off tuition fees.

+ Canada Federal Aid


